Stay at... The Connaught.

The show I'm most looking forward to... Cy Twombly, Sculpture, at Gagosian Grosvenor Hill until 21 December.

If you have only one hour, I recommend...Olafur Eliasson: *In Real Life* and Ed Ruscha (Artist Rooms) both at Tate Modern.

The best place for lunch... Jean-Georges at The Connaught or Scott's in Mayfair. Labels to wear... Phillip Lim, Roksanda and Peter Pilotto.

While you're in London... see the Sterling Ruby Acts + Table sculpture show at Gagosian Britannia Street (2 October – 14 December) and PAD London (above).

At night, you'll find the art crowd hanging out... at Annabel's.
