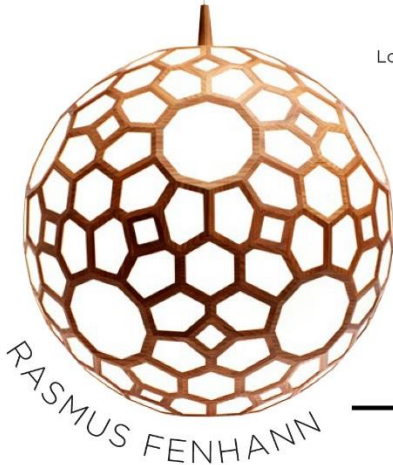

at *Galerie Maria Wettergren*
Inspired by the Japanese art of origami, this elm and paper pendant makes an elegant focal point to the Parisian dealer's display.

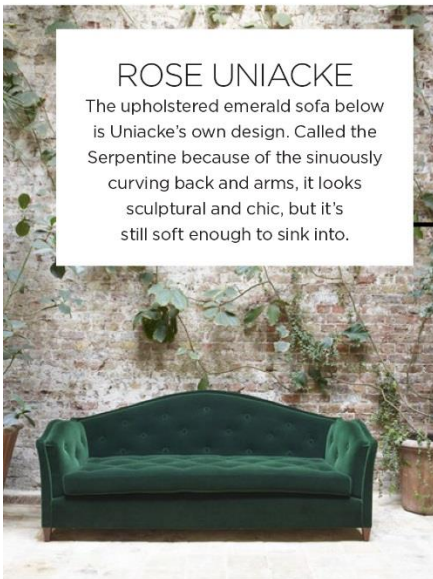

ROSE UNIACKE

The upholstered emerald sofa below is Uniacke's own design. Called the Serpentine because of the sinuously curving back and arms, it looks sculptural and chic, but it's still soft enough to sink into.



PABLO PICASSO

at *Opera Gallery*
The beautiful Picasso painting, *Tête de Femme (Dora Maar)*, depicts the artist's former lover. Maar was herself a talented photographer, poet and painter, as well as being one of the muses who inspired Picasso's work.



DESIGN MVW

at *Galerie BSL*
As part of its aim to blur the boundaries between art and design, the French gallery commissions works that are best described as 'functional sculptures'. This shelving unit was made by the Chinese designer Xu Ming and the French architect Virginie Moriette, who together form Design MVW.

PIPPIN DRYSDALE



at *Adrian Sassoon*
With its rich, saturated colours, this vessel evokes a sunset. It is by the Australian ceramicist Pippin Drysdale, who has been producing pots influenced by vivid desert landscapes for 30 years.

SAM ORLANDO MILLER

at *Gallery Fumi*

A gem-like garnet, amber and silver mirror is one of many one-off or low-edition pieces that the gallery is bringing to PAD and has been cleverly designed to reflect and refract light.



PINTO PARIS

The design brand was founded by the niece of the famous decorator Alberto Pinto, which explains the many unique homewares that it curates and sells. This lamp is hewn from a huge piece of sodalite, creating an object that combines practicality with beauty.

ALEXANDER CALDER

at *Galerie Von Vertes*
Buy your very own Calder kinetic sculpture from these Zurich-based dealers - this one, *La Vache*, dates from 1962.



LUCIO FONTANA

at *De Jonckheere Gallery*

This bright Fontana artwork from 1966 is a striking example of the 20th-century Italian artist and sculptor's oeuvre. It is part of his 'Concetto Spaziale' ('spatial concept') series, in which he explored space by perforating and slashing a block-colour canvas. □
