PAD London returns to Berkeley Square, in the heart of London's affluent Mayfair district this October. Launched in 2007 as the first international fair dedicated to design in the UK, PAD London has been unwavering in its commitment to fostering and promoting the prolific evolution of design in all its forms.

The fair's 15th edition will once again delight art and design lovers with a world-class selection of works spanning Contemporary and 20th Century Design, and Collectible Jewellery.

For 2023, PAD London will be showcasing a strong line-up of 62 international galleries, 13 first-time exhibitors and Designers and makers representing over 30 countries. From major cities across Europe, North America and Asia, they are coming together to offer an exceptional panorama of the most coveted and iconic works available on the market today. Adding fresh perspectives to its rich panorama of contemporary design, PAD's 2023 edition will see the arrival of cutting-edge galleries unveiling new works by rising stars of the design world. These include: Objects with Narratives, Ormond Editions, Florian Daguët-Bresson, Gallery LVS & Craft, Raphaella Riboud-Seydoux, Æquō, Secret Gallery, Galerie Philia and Melchiorri Studio Gallery.

Ground-breaking contemporary ceramics will be a must-see at PAD, with innovative ceramic furniture and sculptures pushing the limits of the
