Taffin

Founded by New York-based French designer James de Givenchy, Taffin pioneered the use and manipulation of ceramic material in high jewellery. Known for creating unique, one-off pieces, the brand showcased publicly for the first time this year at PAD with a range of wearable sculptures, each one more intricate than the next. Hemmerle

Experts in the manipulation of aluminium and other alternative materials, these earrings combine the two core elements of Hemmerle jewellery: complex design and elegant aesthetic. 


Fabio Salini
